D'Amore-McKim's Graduate Certificate in Business Administration allows you to gain forward-thinking, relevant, in-demand business skills that you can apply to your position immediately.

This program consists of four-six graduate-level courses (12-15 credits) where you have the opportunity to align your interests to your goals by choosing one area of focus, or widen the scope and build your expertise on all fundamentals of business.

You can gain this specialized knowledge in one of three ways:

Part-Time MBA path. Study on our Boston campus and take six foundational quantitative and business classes (15 credits) from the D'Amore-McKim MBA curriculum. Students who complete the certificate with a cumulative GPA of 3.3 and a B or better in each of their classes may apply these credits toward the Part-Time MBA and be eligible to waive the GMAT entrance requirement.

Build your own curriculum. Designed to provide you with specialized knowledge in the specific area of business that

interest you most, a Graduate Certificate in Business Administration can give you the power to create your curriculum to match your goals. You may select any four or five graduate business courses (12-15 credits)—just the courses you need to propel you toward your career goals and personal aspirations. Eligible graduates may apply their credits toward our Part-Time MBA program.

100% online. Earn your Graduate Certificate completely online with the ability to customize both your schedule and your curriculum. You'll select four courses (12 credits) from our Online MBA curriculum, and may be eligible to apply your credits toward our Online MBA program upon successful completion.
